The recent Undergraduate Awards Ceremony was a momentous occasion to celebrate our students' hard work, dedication, and academic excellence!



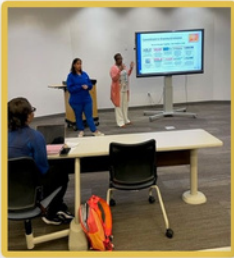

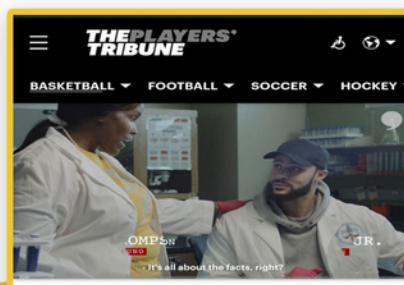

COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT

Forensic Science Program

The SUNO Forensic Science Program has gained national attention with a promotional video, "What If I Were..." by The Players' Tribune, featuring Larry Nance Jr. of the New Orleans Pelicans. The video provides an inside look into the world of forensic science. Nance Jr. himself spent a day exploring various lab protocols and shared his insights in the video.

The promotional video also features Dr. Meiko Thomas, the Director of SUNO's Forensic Science Center Program, and she shared her expertise in forensic science.



On April 1, 2023, Dr. Raymond M. Delaney Jr., Associate Professor, and Dr. Darryl Roberts, Assistant Professor of Criminal Justice at SUNO, participated in The Center for Racial Justice and the City of New Orleans Mayor's Office Public Safety and Crime Summit. The panel discussion was centered on how local academic institutions prepare students to address public safety and crime concerns in urban communities.

During the discussion, Dr. Delaney and Dr. Roberts shared valuable tips and strategies for forming strategic alliances and partnerships with community members, grassroots organizations, law enforcement, and other vital stakeholders to address public safety. Their insights shed light on the importance of community engagement and collaboration in tackling public safety challenges.

The summit provided an excellent platform for experts to share their knowledge and experience and explore ways to address public safety concerns in urban communities effectively. Dr. Delaney and Dr. Roberts' participation in the panel discussion highlights SUNO's commitment to providing students with the necessary skills and knowledge to contribute to public safety and crime prevention efforts.



On March 24, 2023, Dr. George L. Amedee, a Political Science Professor, was sworn in as the 2023-2024 President of the Conference of Minority Public Administrators (COMPAA) during the organization's section meeting at the annual Conference of the American Society of Public Administration (ASPA).
