As a community oriented institution, the Southern University Law Center forges partnerships with organizations that align with its mission. Recently, the Law Center has participated in ongoing partnership with the Andrew Goodman Foundation to increase public awareness and education on civic engagement and voting.

The Andrew Goodman Foundation (AGF) supports youth leadership development, voting accessibility, and social justice initiatives on campuses across the country with mini-grants to select institutions of higher learning and other financial assistance to students.

Our student ambassador, Breana Wilson, has participated in multiple events such as the Andrew Goodman Foundation's Voting Summit, SULC's "Protect The Vote" webinars, and acted as a panelist for "Your Ballot, Your Voice" event hosted by Vote America. "My experience as a Andrew Goodman Foundation Student Ambassador has been a rewarding one," said Wilson. "I have the opportunity to connect with students and advocates from all across the U.S. who are committed to fostering civic engagement by registering students to vote and ensuring that they have the necessary information to exercise their right to vote."

During the recent election season, the Law Center launched a national project called "Why We Vote", a social media campaign that featured individuals from across the country stating reasons why they vote and why others should vote via short videos. This campaign coincided with AGF's "Vote Everywhere" campaign.

In the future, there are plans for community outreach and events to further emphasize the point of being politically savvy and engaged year-round.
