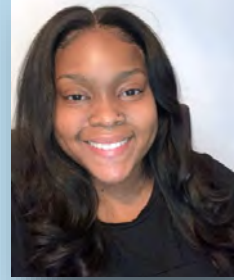

College of Business Seniors Dominique Albert, Ronjhae Emery, and Demetrice Fontenberry, have been chosen as Student Ambassadors by the Society for Financial Education & Professional Development (SFE&PD). Founded in 1998, the SFE&PD is a non-profit organization on a mission to enhance the level of financial education and economic literacy of individuals and households in the United States and to promote professional development. The SFE&PD has presented financial education programs to over 90 colleges and universities across the nation, teaching financial literacy to more than 350,000 college and graduate students.

The Southern University at New Orleans, College of Business & Public Administration entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Society for Financial Education & Professional Development (SFE&PD) on October 2, 2020 to establish and develop on the SUNO campus the SFE&PD Student Ambassador Program (SAP). Through this program, these Student Ambassadors will be tutored in the area of financial literacy empowering them to become peer-to-peer trainers. The Student Ambassadors can then teach fellow students personal financial management concepts while developing new leadership skills. The primary goal is to infuse financial literacy training into the education of college students; thereby empowering students to be able to make sound financial decisions during and after graduation and increase college/university retention and graduation rates.

As ambassadors, these students will:

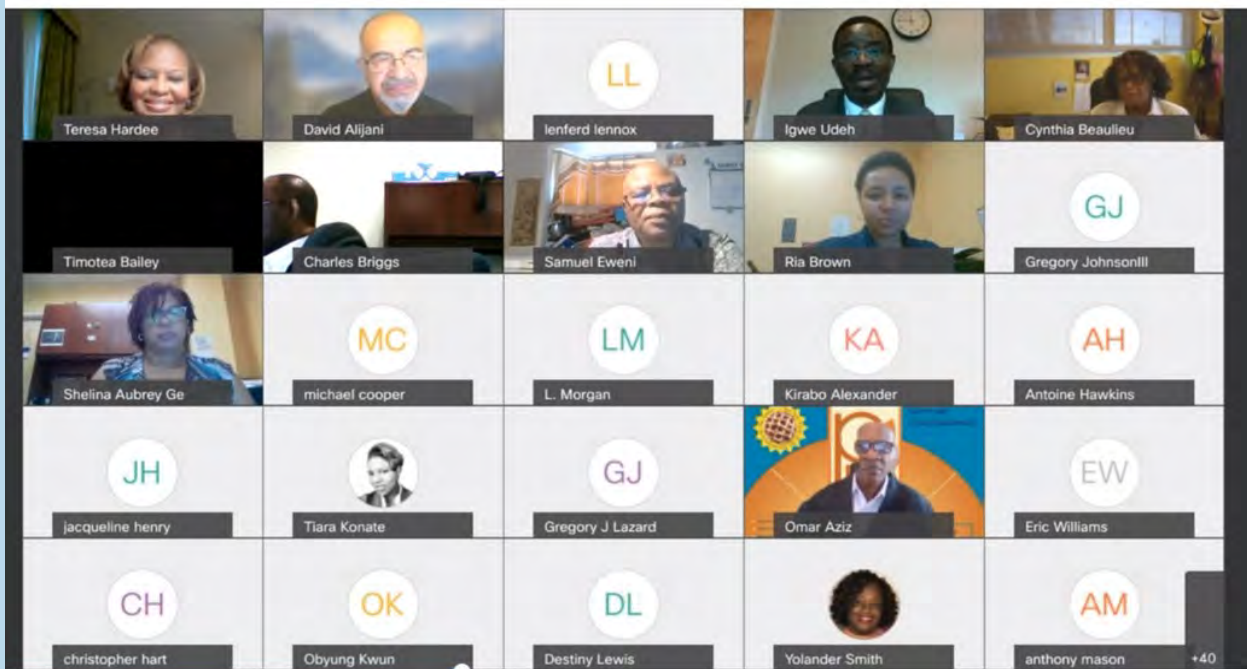
- Participate in all SFE&PD on-campus seminars/workshops, conference calls, webinars, and media training sessions.
- Provide peer-to-peer financial literacy training on campus and in the surrounding community if opportunities are feasible.
- Present 2-3 workshops for fellow students each semester.
- Provide guidance to fellow students on financial issues and give them available financial materials.
- Conduct small-group discussions on financial subjects and assist with campus-wide financial literacy events with SFE&PD/faculty support and promote them on social media.
- Be responsible for promoting and publicizing the financial education events held on the campus.
- Work with SAP Faculty Advisors to develop initiatives for reaching 500 students, campus wide.
- Receive compensation in the amount of \$500 for each semester of participation in the SFE&PD Student Ambassador Program.

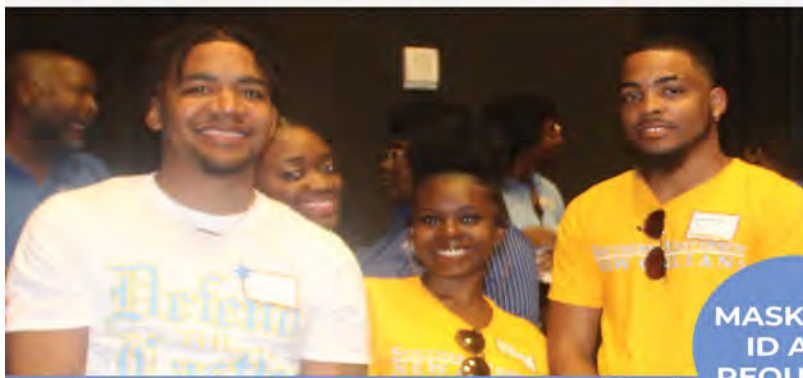
