

## POWER-BASED VIOLENCE MANDATORY REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

An employee who receives a direct statement regarding or witnesses an incident of power-based violence

committed by or against a student is a Responsible Employee, unless designated specifically as a Confidential Advisor (<u>RS 17:3399.13</u>).

A Responsible Employee shall promptly report the incident to the Institution's Title IX Coordinator.

A Responsible Employee **must report** the following to the Title IX Coordinator:

- 1) The identity of the alleged victim;
- 2) The identity of the alleged perpetrator;
- The type of power-based violence or retaliation alleged to have been committed;
- Any other information about witnesses, location, date, and time that the incident occurred; and
- 5) Any other relevant information.

A responsible employee **is not required to make a report** if the information is received under the following circumstances:

- a) During a public forum or awareness event;
- b) During an academic assignment; or
- c) Indirectly while overhearing a conversation.

## TYPES OF POWER-BASED VIOLENCE

Power-based violence (<u>RS 17:3399.12(5)</u>) means any form of interpersonal violence intended to control or intimidate another person through the assertion of power over the person and **shall include the following:**
